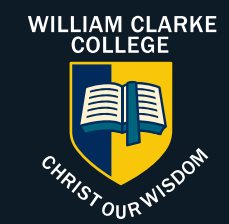

OUR PURPOSE



A CHRIST-CENTRED COMMUNITY

From the very first day until now, William Clarke College has always grounded every aspect of school life to the person and work of Jesus Christ, captured by our motto Christ Our Wisdom. This means that the basis of how we think of ourselves and how we think of other people is based on Biblical principles and wisdom.

In particular, we believe that every individual human is valuable and precious because they are made in God's image (Genesis 1:29). We know that many young people struggle with insecurities when their identity is tied too closely with their achievements. Instead, we want our students to know that they are loved and valued regardless of their achievements. The Christian message is that all people, no matter who they are or what they have done, can find peace, hope, forgiveness and purpose through Jesus Christ. Secure in their identity, students can free from the burden of trying to prove themselves, and so use the gifts and talents they have been given to contribute positively to others in God's world.

Modern research has confirmed what the Bible has taught for millennia, namely that humans flourish in the context of good relationships. For this reason, William Clarke College is a learning community, where students are encouraged to learn in a network of strong relationships. We foster students to have strong relationships with each other, with staff, and with God.

We welcome all people to join our Christ-centred community, even those who are not Christian. In their time at the College, students will explore the Bible and its claims about Jesus and his message so that they can develop their own personal response.

DEVELOPING EXTRAORDINARY LEARNERS

The world is changing at an ever-increasing rate and predicting the future with certainty is impossible. Our aim is for our students to develop as extraordinary learners, so they are well-equipped to flourish and face the challenges of the future with confidence.

Extraordinary learners pursue growth in three key areas:

- Christ-like character: commitment to a life of virtue, where a student can bring hope to others by showing compassion, courage, hope, integrity and humility, following the example of Christ.
- Academic mastery: building on strong foundations of literacy and numeracy, students will make substantial progress in their knowledge and skills across a range of domains while exploring the big ideas that matter.
- Enterprise skills: key competencies that describe the skills and attributes for learners to flourish regardless of any unpredictable challenges they face. These are the 5 Cs of collaboration, critical thinking, communication, creativity and citizenship.

As students move through the College, they will have increased capacity for choice, giving them a strong sense of agency and empowering them to be owners and directors of their own learning journey. Our learning spaces are flexible and designed to facilitate a rigorous curriculum that promotes success at school and beyond school.

Every student matters, and so we tailor learning experiences that challenge each student at the right level so that they can grow. After all, growth only comes through challenge.

Our excellent staff are highly relational and seek to foster intrinsic motivation in students through highly engaging learning experiences.

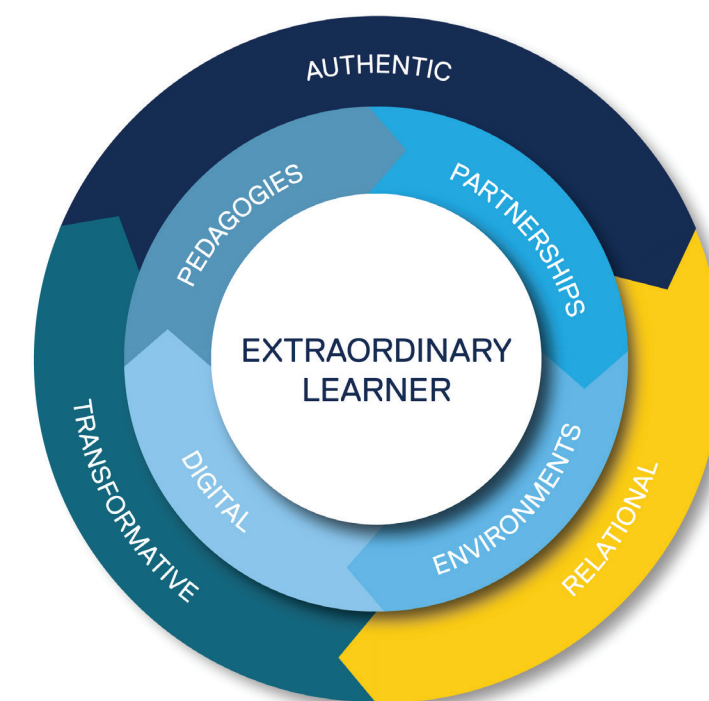
